Selecting fine audio equipment such as the unit you've just purchased is only the start of your musical enjoyment. Now it's time to consider how you can maximize the fun and excitement your equipment offers. - Start your volume control at a low setting.
- Slowly increase the sound until you can hear it comfortably and clearly, and without distortion.

Once you have established a comfortable sound level:

Set the dial and leave it there.

- 7. Ventilation Slots and openings in the cabinet are provided for ventilation and to ensure reliable operation of the product and to protect it from overheating, and these openings must not be blocked or covered. 

POWER SOURCE

This unit is designed to operate on 120V/60Hz AC house current. Operating this unit from any other power source may cause damage to the unit, and such damage is not covered by your warranty.

The radio is also pre-loaded with 2 x "AA" batteries for the battery back-up and for the Auto Time Set clock system.

BATTERY BACK - UP SYSTEM

The Battery Back-up System ensures the clock and alarm settings will be retained during a power interruption or power outage (in order to preserve the battery life the Display will not light). All clock settings will be kept in memory, however, the clock time may require adjustment for exact accuracy once the power returns. If the batteries are not installed, the Display will blink"12:00" when the power is restored. This will indicate that you have to reset the time and alarm settings.

BATTERY INSTALLATION


- 1. Open the battery compartment door on the bottom of the cabinet.
- Insert 2 "AA" size batteries into the battery compartment according to the polarity diagram engraved inside the compartment.
- 3. Replace the battery compartment Door.
 - IMPORTANT: Be sure that the batteries are installed correctly. Wrong polarity may damage the unit.
- Alkaline-type batteries are recommended. For optimum performance, these batteries should be replaced after every year or when batteries become exhausted.
- Old or leaking battery can cause damage to the unit and will void the warranty.
- 6. Use only the size and type of batteries specified.
- 7. Do not mix old and new batteries.
- Do not mix alkaline, standard (carbon-zinc) or rechargeable (nickelcadmium) batteries.
- Do not try to recharge batteries not intended to be recharged; they can overheat, rupture and leak. (Follow battery manufacturer's directions).
- 10. Do not dispose of batteries in fire, batteries may leak or explode.

POWER FAILURE INDICATOR


If there are no batteries installed in the unit or if the batteries installed are weak or dead, the time and alarm settings will be lost if the AC power is interrupted. When the AC power is restored the display will blink"12:00". This indicates that the time displayed is incorrect and needs to be reset. **IMPORTANT:**


After you reset the time, be sure to reset your alarm settings as well.

LOCATION OF CONTROLS AND INDICATORS










1. POWER ON/OFF BUTTON	9. TUNNING CONTROL

OPERATING INSTRUCTIONS

AUTO TIME SET

This unit features an Automatic Time Set system powered by 2 X "AA" batteries (3V DC) (Included), so you do not need to set the clock time when first plugged in. After the unit is plugged in, the LED display will show the current time automatically after you set the time zone and daylight saving time for desired area.

SETTING THE TIME ZONE

Change to your time zone area by sliding the TIME ZONE switch on the back of the unit to the appropriate time zone you live in. The default time zone is set to Eastern Standard Time (EST). Please refer to the time zone map below when setting the switch position on the back.

- Eastern Standard Time (EST)
- Central Standard Time (CST)
- Mountain Standard Time (MST)
- Pacific Standard Time (PST)



DAYLIGHT SAVING TIME

Slide the DST (Daylight Saving Time) switch on back of the unit to turn Daylight saving time on/off. The clock comes with DST in the ON position as the default. This setting is correct unless you live in Arizona or parts of Indiana where DST is not observed.

IMPOTANT: Do not change this setting unless you live in an area which does not observe the Daylight Saving time change.

NOTE: The batteries will become weak after time, so replace the batteries as needed. To avoid re-program the time and alarm settings, we recommend leaving the unit plugged in when changing the batteries.

SETTING THE CLOCK

In case the back-up batteries are accidentally removed. You will need to set the clock manually.

If the LED display is blinking

- In standby mode, press the UP button to increase or press the DOWN button to decrease the minutes setting.
- Press and hold the UP / DOWN button to fast forward/backward the clock setting.
- Press the BAND/SET button or waiting 5 seconds to confirm the setting.

If the LED display is steady

- In standby mode, press and hold BAND/SET button for 3 seconds, AM or PM indicator flashes on LED display,
- Press the UP button to increase or press the DOWN button to decrease the minutes setting.
- 3. Press and hold the UP / DOWN button to fast forward/backward the clock setting.
- 4. Press the BAND/SET button again to confirm.

NOTE

There are AM and PM indicators located in the left-hand corner of the clock display. Be sure to observe the correct AM / PM indicator when setting the alarm to make sure the wake time is set correctly for AM or PM.

LISTENING TO RADIO

- 1. Switch AUX IN / RADIO selector to select radio mode.
- Press the ON/OFF button once to turn on the unit, display shows FM or AM frequency for 5 seconds.
- 3. Press the BAND/SET button once to select AM / FM band.
- Rotary the TUNING control knob to select your desired radio broadcasting station. Display will return to show current time after tuning control idle for 5 seconds.
- 5. Adjust VOLUME control to your desired listening level.

When you have finished listening, press the ON/OFF button once to turn off the unit.

TIPS FOR BEST RADIO RECEPTION

- AM The AM antenna is built inside the radio. If AM reception is weak, change the position of the unit until the internal antenna picks up the strongest signal.
- FM If FM reception is weak, fully extend the wire antenna and vary the position and location of the antenna until you find the strongest signal.

ALARM OPERATION

SETTING THE WAKE UP TIME

This unit has Dual Alarm function. Each ALARM can be set to wake to RADIO or ALARM. To set alarm time:

- Press and hold ALARM1 or ALARM2 button for 3 seconds to enter the ALARM setting mode, LED shows the default alarm time 12:00 AM and the ALARM1 or ALARM2 indicator flashing on the display.
- Press UP / DOWN button to adjust minutes of you desired ALARM
 time. Press and hold the button for fast forward / backward setting
 the alarm time.
- Press ALARM1 or ALARM2 button again to confirm the ALARM time setting.
- Press ALARM1 or ALARM2 repeatedly to select wake to ALARM (bUZ), RADIO (rAd) or turn off the alarm.

CHECKING THE WAKE UP TIMES

Whenever you want to check the wake up time, simply press and hold the ALARM 1 or ALARM 2 button for 3 seconds. The display will change from current time to wake up time. Release the ALARM button, it will return to current time after 5 seconds.

WAKE TO RADIO

- To select wake to radio mode, press the ALARM button you want to set repeatedly until display shows "rAd".
- Release ÁLARM button and waiting about 5 seconds to confirm.
- NOTE: 1. Ensuring a desired radio station is tuned and proper volume is set.
 - If you set the AUX IN / RADIO switch to AUX IN position, buzzer alarm will sound instead of radio.
- The radio will automatically turn on and ALARM indicator flashing when alarm time is reached.
- 4. The radio alarm will keep sounding for 60 minutes and then automatically shut off until same time on the following day.

- To stop the alarm immediately, press the ON/OFF button once. The radio will stop but the alarm remains set and will turn the unit on again at the same time on the following day.
- To turn off the alarm completely, press the ALARM button repeatedly until ALARM indicator turns off.

WAKE TO BUZZER

- To select wake to buzzer mode, press the ALARM button repeatedly until the display shows "bUZ".
- 2. Release ALARM button and wait about 5 seconds to confirm the setting.
- The buzzer alarm will automatically turn on and the ALARM indicator will flash when alarm time is reached. It starts softly and becomes gradually louder.
- 4. The buzzer alarm will keep sounding for 60 minutes and then automatically shut off until same time on the following day.
- To stop the alarm immediately, press the ON/OFF button once. The buzzer alarm will stop but the alarm remains set and will turn the unit on again at the same time on the following day.
- To turn off the buzzer alarm completely, press the ALARM button repeatedly until ALARM indicator turns off.

NOTE: If you set the second alarm and it is reached while the first alarm is sounding, the second alarm will sound and cancel the previous alarm.

SNOOZE OPERATION

You may active the SNOOZE function manually after the alarm sounds by pressing the SNOOZE button. The snooze time can be adjusted from 1 ~ 30 minutes, the default snooze time setting is 9 minutes.

SNOOZE TIME SETTING:

- In standby mode, press and hold SNOOZE for 3 seconds, the display shows current snooze time and flashes.
- 2. Press the UP / DOWN button to increase / decrease the snooze time.
- 3. Press the SNOOZE button again to confirm.

SNOOZE FUNCTION

- When the ALARM sounds, press the SNOOZE button to pause the ALARM. The ALARM will come again after your pre-set SNOOZE time is reached.
- When the Snooze time starts, press the SNOOZE button again to check remaining time left.
- 3. This manual snooze operation can be repeated again and again.

BACKLIGHT BRIGHTNESS OPERATION

You can change the LED brightness by switching the HI / LO dimmer switch located on the side of the cabinet.

AUXILIARY INPUT

This unit features an AUX line-in jack for connecting your iPod, MP3 player or other digital music players.

- Connect the headphone jack of your external device to the AUX IN jack located on the back of the unit (cable not included).
- Turn on the unit and set the FUNCTION Selector to the "AUX IN" position.
- 3. Start playing your iPod, MP3 player or other external audio device.
- Slowly adjust both volume controls on the unit and the external device.
- 5. Turn off your iPod, MP3 player etc. when finish listening.
- 6. Turn the unit off and unplug the AUX Line-in jack.

CARE AND MAINTENANCE

- 1. If the cabinet becomes dusty, wipe the exterior with a soft dust cloth only. Never use dusting sprays or polishes on the cabinet.
- If the cabinet becomes dirty or smudged with fingerprints it may be wiped with a soft cloth that has been slightly dampened with a mild soap and water solution.
- 3. Always disconnect the power cord from the AC outlet before cleaning. Never allow any liquid to get inside the cabinet.

NOTE

- If there are no batteries in the battery back-up compartment, the Auto Set Time and Alarm settings will be lost when the AC power cord is disconnected for cleaning. You will need to reset the clock and alarm time(s) after reconnecting the AC power cord. Follow the "SETTING THE CLOCK" section above if needed.
- 2. If "AtS" is shown on the display during normal operation, please press the power ON/OFF button once to return to normal operation.
