POWER SOURCE


This unit is designed to operate on an external AC adaptor rated at 5V === 2100mA (included). Operating this unit on any other power source may cause damage to the unit, and such damage is not covered by your warranty.

It's also equipped with a battery back-up system for the clock that is powered by 1 x 3V === type CR2032 Lithium battery (not included).

AC-DC Adaptor Connection

An AC-DC Adaptor with the output 5V === 2100mA (Included) is required for operating the main unit. To connect the AC-DC Adaptor to the unit and 120V~ 60Hz AC Outlet:

- Firmly and securely insert the DC plug of the adaptor into the DC IN Jack at the back of the unit.
- 2. Plug the adaptor's AC plugs into a power outlet rated at 120V~ 60Hz.



Battery Backup for Clock

The radio is equipped with a clock backup system. It requires a 3 V lithium battery (type: CR2032). The backup battery compartment is located at rear of the unit.

- 1. Use a screw driver to loose the battery compartment lid screw.
- 2. Carefully to open the battery compartment lid by pull it out.
- 3. Install a DC 3V CR2032 type Lithium battery (with the polarity plus "+" side facing up) the battery into the battery compartment and make sure the positive and negative (+ or -) sides of the battery are in contact with the corresponding terminals in the battery compartment.

- 4. Put the battery compartment lid back into battery compartment
- 5. Tighten the screw of battery compartment lid.

Note:

- 1.) If power outage occurs, the unit automatically switches to the battery power supply and keeps the clock and alarm settings.
- 2.) When replacing the battery, do not disconnect the power adapter. Otherwise, all clock and alarm settings will be lost.

NOTE: Only use a well-known brand of battery to ensure the longest life and best performance.

Battery Precautions

- · Replacement of batteries must be done by an adult.
- The supply terminals are not to be short-circuited.
- Non-rechargeable batteries are not to be recharged.
- · Exhausted batteries are to be removed.
- Only batteries of the equivalent type are to be used.
- Batteries are to be inserted with the correct polarity.
- Dispose of batteries properly. Do not dispose of batteries in fire. The batteries may explode or leak.



NOTE ON NON-MAGNETICALLY SHIELDED SPEAKERS



TOP VIEW



GETTING STARTED

TURNING THE UNIT POWER ON/OFF

- In Off (standby) mode, tap the **POWER** ^(b) button on main unit to turn the unit ON.
 - The last selected input mode icon will show on LED display.
- 2. To turn the unit OFF (standby), tap the **POWER** 🖒 button on main unit again.

SETTING THE CLOCK

CLOCK SETTING

After plugging in the AC adaptor, "12:00" will appear on the LED display.

- In Power Off (Standby) mode, press and hold the CLOCK button on the top panel. The year digits will show in display and keep blinking to prompt for input.
- Tap the BACKWARD ◄ or FORWARD ► button to select the year. Tap the button to confirm, Month digit will be flashing.
- Tap the ◄◄or ▶► button to adjust the Month, tap the button to confirm. Date digit will be flashing.
- Tap the ◄◄or ▶► button to adjust the date, tap the button to confirm. 12 hour clock format "12 Hr" will be flashing.
- Tap the ◄◄or ➤> button to select 24 hour format if necessary. Otherwise, tap the button to confirm.
- 6. Hour digits will be flashing, tap the ◄ or ▶ button to adjust the hour. Press and hold the button for fast advance / reverse setting.
 - **Note:** Make sure the hour is set so that the **PM** indicator is displayed correctly.
- Tap the button to confirm the hour setting, the minute digits will flash Tap the ◄ or ➤ button to adjust the minute. Press and hold the button for fast advance / reverse setting.
- 8. Tap the button again to complete the setting.

Daylight saving time (DST)

Press and hold the ▶ button to activate daylight saving time when it is in force in your area. Press and hold the ▶ button to deactivate this function.

Display Information

In unit standby mode, tap the ◀ button repeatedly to check the date, year and return to clock display.

ALARM OPERATION

SETTING THE ALARM CLOCK

This function allows the system to turn on automatically and wake you using a beeping alarm, FM radio or the Nature Sound.

- 1. In standby mode, tap the **ALARM 1 10** button on top panel of the main, default alarm time AM 7:00 will appear in display. Press and hold the **10** button again until Hour digit of alarm clock start flashing to prompt for input.
- Tap the BACKWARD ◄ or FORWARD ▶ button to set the hour and then press the the button again to confirm, Minute digits will be flashing. Note: Make sure the hour is set so that the PM indicator is displayed correctly.
- 3. Tap the ◄ or ▶ button to set the minute and then press the to button again to confirm, default weekdays 1 5 repeat alarm setting will show and flash.
- 4. Tap the ◄◄ or ▶► button to select weekdays (1-5), every day (1-7), weekend (6-7) or single weekday alarm. Tap the to button again to confirm, alarm wake up source will appear in display.
- 5. Tap the ◀◀ or ▶▶ button to select wake to Beeping Alarm (bu), Nature Sound Alarm (nS) or FM radio and then press the to button again to confirm, Alarm sounding volume level will appear in display.

 Nato: When select wake to Nature Sound display will show N 1 of Nature.
 - **Note:** When select wake to Nature Sound, display will show N 1 of Nature Sound and flashing. You can use ◀ or ▶▶ to select one of three Nature Sound by N1 N3 you preferred.
- Tap the ◄◄ or ►► button to preset the wake up alarm volume level and then tap the button to to confirm, Lamp light level will be flashing.
 Note: No alarm volume level setting for Beeping alarm.
- 7. Tap the ◀◀ or ▶▶ button to preset the wake up alarm lamp lighting level and then tap the **3** button to finish alarm setup.

NOTE:

- 1.) The system provides dual alarm settings so you can preset another wake up time individually by using the **ALARM 2 ②** button.
- 2.) For 'Wake to Radio", the system will default to the last radio station listened to before switching off.
- 3.) The wake-up reading lamp can be set at a light intensity level from L01 to L20 or off. If a light intensity level from L01 to L20 is set, the reading lamp will switch on at its lowest intensity 30 minutes before the set alarm time.
- 4.) The light will then gradually increase to the set brightness level until the alarm goes off. For example, if the alarm is set for 8:30 with a light intensity of L10, the reading lamp will switch on at 8:00 at the lowest level (L01) and gradually increase to the light level L10 at 8:30.
- 5.) The light will not turn on if the alarm is set less than 30 minutes before the set time.

ACTIVE / DE-ACTIVE THE ALARM FUNCTION

- To active ALARM 1, press and hold the "m" button until the alarm indicator "AL1" is shown on LED display.
- 2. To cancel ALARM 1 function by press and hold the "to" button again until the alarm indicator "AL1" goes off.
- 3. Follow the same operation by pressing to button to active / de-active ALARM 2 "AL 2" function

Wake to FM Radio, Nature Sound or Beeping Alarm

- When the alarm time is reached, the FM radio, Nature Sound or beeping alarm will sound for 30 minutes then shut off and reset itself for the following day (without pressing the snooze button). You may activate the snooze function manually after the alarm sounds by pressing the SNOOZE (LAMP ON/OFF) button. The alarm stops for the snooze time (9 minutes) then comes again. The snooze operation can be repeated again within the remaining 30 minutes from the set alarm time.
- To stop the alarm immediately after it sounds, tap the ALARM OFF button on the top panel once. It resets itself for the following day.
 Note: VOLUME UP/DOWN buttons no function when alarm sounding.
- To cancel the following day alarm, press and hold the 10 or 12 button until corresponding ALARM indicator AL1 or AL2 goes off from display.

SNOOZE FUNCTION

- 1. Press the SNOOZE **(LAMP ON/OFF)** button on the main unit to terminate the alarm mode temporarily, and the alarm will re-start again after 9 minutes on each press.
 - **Note:** Wake up light will be turned off and will not light again when snooze time expired.
- 2. To cancel the SNOOZE mode, press the ∑ **(a)** or **(b)** button once. The corresponding alarm icon "AL1" or "AL2" stops flashing.

RADIO OPERATION

- 1. Tap the **POWER** button on main unit to turn on the unit.
- 2. Tap the **SOURCE** button on main to select Radio mode, the "FM" mode and radio frequency appear in display.
- 3. To manually tune to a specific radio station, tap the ◀◀ or ▶▶ button on either the main unit repeatedly. Use the manual tuning method to tune in weaker stations that are bypassed during Automatic Tuning.
- 4. To automatically tune to the next available radio station, press and hold the ◄ or ▶ button for 1-2 seconds until frequency readout on the display begins to scan and then release the button. The tuner will stop scanning when it receives the next broadcasting station of adequate signal strength.
- 5. Press the volume control / button on main unit to adjust the volume control to the desired volume level.

HINTS FOR BEST RECEPTION:

The receiver has a build-in FM wire antenna hanging from the back of the cabinet. This wire should be totally unwrapped and fully extended for the best reception.

NOTE: Automatic tuning depends on the signal strength of the broadcasting station, so weak stations may be skipped. You can manually tune to find the weak stations if a station gets skipped. With strong signals, the tuner may stop before it reaches the actual broadcast frequency, so you may need to manually tune for the best reception.

PRESET RADIO STATIONS

- 1. Press the 🖒 button on main unit to turn on the unit.
- 2. Tap the **SOURCE** button to select Radio mode.
- Tune to the desired radio station either by "manually" or "automatically" tuning method.
- 4. Press and hold the PRESET button on main unit; the next available preset memory number flash in the LED display. (Note:"P01" will blink in the display if you are programming preset for first time)
- Tap the ◄◄ or ▶► button to select the preset number you want to assign the station to.
- 6. Tap the **b** button to confirm the setting.
- 7. Repeat step #3 thru # 6 to preset up to 10 stations.

RECALLING PRESET MEMORY CHANNELS

In radio mode, recall the pre-set channels by tapping the • button repeatedly.

NOTE:

The clock and radio station presets will need to be reset if the power is interrupted or in the event of a power outage. Please follow above steps 1-7 above to resave the preset stations.

SLEEP OPERATION

The sleep timer allows you to turn the unit off after a designated time is reached.

- 1. To activate the sleep timer, turn the unit on and tap the **SOURCE** button to select FM radio, nature sound or listening to music via AUX IN.
- 2. Tap the **SLEEP** (button, the sleep time will appear on the display.
- 3. Repeatedly tap the **SLEEP** button to select a sleep time. The unit will turn off after 15, 30, 60 or 90 minutes. Wait for 10 seconds after your selection for the unit to confirm the selection, the unit will play for the selected length of time then automatically turn off.
- 4. To cancel the sleep timer, tap the & button repeatedly until timer shows "OFF".
- 5. To turn the unit off before the selected length of time, press the **POWER** button at any time.

Notes:

- 1.) To check the remaining sleep time, tap the & button once.
- If you are falling asleep to music from an external device connected to the AUX input, the sleep timer will shut off the power to this system but it will not turn off the external device.

AUXILIARY INPUT OPERATION

This unit features an auxiliary audio signal input jack for connecting external audio devices like MP3 players, Digital Audio Device and listen to them through the speakers of this unit.

- Use an audio cable (not included) with one 3.5 mm stereo plug on each end of the cable.
- 2. Plug one end into the **AUX IN** jack on the main unit and the other end of the cable into the Line-out Jack or Headphone Jack of your external audio device.
- 3. Turn on the unit and external audio device.

- Tap the SOURCE button on main to select AUX mode, "AUX" indicator will show in display.
- 5. The volume level can now be controlled through the main unit. Operate all other functions on the auxiliary device as usual.

Note:

- If you connect this unit to the Line-Out Jack of your external device then you
 only need to adjust the volume control of this unit. If you connect the Headphone
 Jack of your external device then you may need to adjust both the volume
 controls of your external device and this unit to obtain the desirable volume
 setting.
- Press the POWER button on main unit to turn off the unit when you have finished listening. Don't forget to switch off the power of your external device as well.

LISTENING TO NATURE SOUNDS

- 1. Press the Power 🖱 button to turn on the unit.
- 2. Tap the **SOURCE** button to select Nature sound mode. Nature sound "n-1, n-2 or n-3" will show in display for a few seconds before show normal clock.
- 3. Tap the ◄ or ▶ button to select different Nature Sound.
- 4. Tape the SOURCE button to change to other operation mode or tap the 🖒 button to turn off the unit

DISPLAY BRIGHTNESS

Press the DISPLAY Hi/LOW DIM 普 button to change the brightness level of the display (2 levels).

Note: Display brightness will set to Hi automatically if you turn on reading lamp or mood light.

READING LAMP OPERATION

- Press the **LAMP ON/OFF** button on main unit to turn on the reading lamp.
- Tap the brightness button ♀ or ☆button to control the brightness of the lamp. There are total 20 levels of lamp brightness control.
- Press the **LAMP ON/OFF** button on main unit to turn on the lamp.

NOTE: Brightness control is not function to multi color MOOD lamp.

MOOD LIGHT OPERATION

- Press the MOOD LIGHT ON/OFF button to turn on or off the mood light. The light will alternate in different colors.

CHARGING YOUR SMART PHONE OR PORTABLE DEVICE

This unit features a 1 AMP USB port on the top of the unit for charging your portable device (iPod, iPhone, Android phone, etc.) when used with the USB charging cord that came with your device.

- Plug one end of the USB cable (not included) into the USB Charging Port located on the back of the unit. Plug the other end of the cord into the device you wish to charge.
- 2. Observe the battery charge indicator on your device to make sure the charging process starts normally.
- 3. Unplug the cable when your device is fully charged.

CAUTION:

Before charging, please refer to the user manual of the device you wish to charge to make sure the charging current requested does not exceed 1A (1000mA). Overloading the charging circuit may damage the unit permanently and void the warranty.

- 1. The USB charging port of this unit supplies a DC 5V output at 1000 mA maximum current to charge your smart phone or portable device battery and it cannot support any other voltage range.
- Make sure the device you want to charge has a battery charge rating of DC 5V only.
- 3. The USB port of this unit is designed for smart phone or portable device battery charging only and it cannot support data transfer or connect to computer.
- 4. Do not connect the USB port of this unit to other external power charger USB ports, it may damage both units and void the warranty.

Note:

- 1.) Some smart phones and portable devices use proprietary USB connections and circuitry, so they may not charge when plugged into the USB port. Please refer to your device user manual before you attempt to charge them.
- 2.) It is normal if the unit gets warm while the USB port is in use and charging your smart phone or portable device.
- 3.) Do not charge your smart phone over 12 hours continuously. Disconnect your smart phone or other portable device from the USB cord once it is fully charged.

CARE AND MAINTENANCE

- If the cabinet becomes dusty, wipe the exterior with a soft dust cloth only. Never use dusting sprays or polishes on the cabinet.
- 2. If the cabinet becomes dirty or smudged with fingerprints it may be wiped with a soft cloth that has been slightly dampened with a mild soap and water solution.
- To prevent fire or shock hazard, always disconnect the power cord from the AC outlet before cleaning.

CAUTION: Never allow any water or other liquids to get inside the unit while cleaning.
