SB6060 OWNER'S MANUAL



IMPORTANT SAFETY INSTRUCTIONS FOR AUDIO PRODUCTS-READ CAREFULLY ALL THE FOLLOWING IMPORTANT SAFEGUARDS

When using electrical products, basic precautions should always be followed including:

- 1. **Read Instructions** - All the safety and operating instructions should be read before the product is operated.
- Retain Instructions The safety and operating instructions should be retained for future 2. reference.

- 7. Water and Moisture - Do not use this product near water-for example, near a bath tub wash bowl, kitchen sink, or laundry tub, in a wet basement, or near a swimming pool, etc.
- Accessories Do not place this product on an unstable cart, stand, tripod, bracket, or table. 8. The product may fall, causing serious injury to a child or adult, and serious damage to the product. Use only with a cart. stand. tripod, bracket, or table recommended by the Manufacturer, or sold with the product. Any mounting of the product should follow the manufacturer's instructions, and should use a mounting accessory recommended by the manufacturer.
- 9. **Transporting** - A product and cart combination should be moved with care. Quick stops, excessive force, and uneven surfaces may cause the product and cart combination to overturn.

Before Use


- 1. Choose unit installation location carefully. Avoid placing it in direct sunlight or close to a source of heat. Also avoid locations subject to vibrations and excessive dust, cold or moisture. Keep away from sources that hum, such as transformers or motors.
- 2. Do not open the cabinet as this might result in damage to the circuitry or electrical shock, if a foreign object should get into the set, contact your dealer.
- 3. Be sure not to handle discs with dirty fingers. Never insert a disc that has a crack on the surface.
- 4. When removing the power plug from the wall outlet, always pull directly on the plug, never pull the cord.
- 5. To keep the laser pickup clean, do not touch it, and do not forget to close the disc tray.
- 6. Do not attempt to clean the unit with chemical solvents as this might damage the finish. Use a clean, dry cloth.
- 7. Keep this manual in a safe place for future reference.


Beware of Condensation

When the radio is moved from a cold or warm place, or is used after a sudden temperature change, there is a danger of condensation. Water vapor in the air could condense on the mechanism. To prevent this, if you are going to use the radio in a condition where condensation could occur, you should leave the radio for 1 or 2 hours after plugging it into an AC outlet depending on the amount of condensation. If this is done, the radio will stabilize at the temperature of its surroundings.

Handling a record, tape or compact Disc

Compact Disc

Handing the Discs:

This unit has been designed specifically for sound reproduction from compact discs bearing the mark

```
mark DIGITAL AUDIO .
```

No other discs can be used.

- Always place the compact disc in the disc tray with the label facing upward. (Compact discs can be played only on one side).
- To remove a disc from its storage case, press down on the centre of the case and lift the disc out, holding it carefully by the edge.
- Fingerprints and dust should be carefully wiped off the disc recorded surface with a clean cloth (not included).
- Never use chemicals such as: record sprays, anti-static sprays or fluid, benzene or thinner to clean compact discs. Such chemicals will do irreparable damage to the disc's plastic surface.
- Discs should be returned to their cases after use to avoid serious scratches that could cause the laser pick up to skip.
- Do not expose discs to direct sunlight or high humidity and temperature for extended periods.
- Do not stick paper or write anything with a ballpoint pen on the surface of the label side.
- Do not use irregular shaped CD's (octagonal, heart-shape, etc.), all of which can damage the unit.


Preparation for Use to the mains

1. Connect the AC power cord to the mains.

CAUTION: TO PREVENT ELECTRIC SHOCK, MATCH WIDE BLADE OF PLUG TO WIDE SLOT, FULLY INSERT.



2. The silver screw protects the phonograph chassis during transportation. If the speed of your phonograph seems slow or you hear a rubbing sound, adjust the screw with a coin to correct the balance of the turntable.



How to Replace the Turntable Stylus

Removing old stylus

- 1. Set a screwdriver at the tip of the stylus and push down to the direction "A".
- 2. Remove the stylus by pulling it down and forward.

Installing a new stylus

- 1. Hold the tip of the stylus and insert the other edge by pressing in the direction "B".
- 2. Push up in the direction "C" until it locks at the tip.





Basic Operation

1.Power on.

Connect the power plug into the wall outlet. Turn the unit on by turning the volume knob clockwise. The FM Band Indicator lights.

2.Select the source.





3. Adjust the volume.




Listening to a Record

1. Press the PHONO button.



2. Select player speed.







- 3. Put a record onto the turntable (use the 45 rpmadaptor provided when playing a single record).
- 4. Remove the tone arm-rest holder.
- 5. Lift the Que-lever and move the tone arm gently to the desired position over the record.
- 6. Lower the Que-lever slowly.
- 7. Return to the tone arm to the tone arm-rest after reaching the end of the record.

Listening to TAPE

- 1. Load Cassette Tape into the unit (located on side of the unit) Playback will automatically begin.
- 2. Press button halfway to Fast Forward the Tape. Press button lightly and playback will resume.
- 3. Press button all the way to end playback and eject Tape.





Listening to a CD

1. Press the CD button.




"--" blinks for a few seconds, when the CD exit and enter into CD door, or the unit do not play CD.

2. Open the tray by pressing the OPEN/CLOSE button. Then put the CD on the tray.



Press OPEN/CLOSE button to close the tray, then press PLAY/PAUSE button to start playing the CD.




The CD will start playing from the first track.

4. Press the F.F button once to go the start of the next track.

5. Press the F.R button once to go back to the start of the current track. Press the F.R button twice to go back to the start of the previous track.


Fast Reverse (F.R) and Fast Forward (F.F) You can reverse or forward to any point in a selected track by pushing and holding the F.R or F.F button.



NOTE: Do not push both buttons together as this may damage the unit.

As the unit is tracking quickly, forward or backward you will hear your selection playing at a distorted speed. Simply release the depressed button to continue playing at normal speed at the desired position in the selected track.


6. Pausing the CD play.




Pressing the PLAY/PAUSE button will restart playing the CD where it was paused

7. Stopping the CD play








Listening to the Radio

1. Press the AM or FM button to select the desired band.



2. Tune to the desired frequency.






3. FM Reception

Any strong FM station will cause the FM Stereo Indicator (FM ST
) to illuminate. Weaker stations cannot be received in stereo

4. Antenna

For optimal FM reception stretch the built-in FM antenna wire located at the lower back of the unit and move it around until the station you have tuned in is being received clearly.

L	Problem	Cause	Solution
THE WHOLE UNIT	Power does not come on when the power switch is pressed.	Unit is unplugged.	Connect the unit to the AC power supply.
	No sound comes out of the speakers.	The volume is turned down (to MIN). The input selector does not match the playback source.	Adjust the volume. Re-select the desired input source.
	The sound is noisy.	The unit is too close to a TV set or another similar appliance.	Turn off the TV or other appliance, and relocate the unit.
TAPE DECK	The cassette deck door cannot be closed.	The cassette tape is not inserted properly.	Insert the cassette tape correctly.
	The tape does not move.	The cassette tape is not inserted properly. The tape has reached the end.	Insert the cassette tape correctly. Flip the cassette.
	No sound from tape.	The tape heads are dirty.	Clean the tape heads.
	The sound is distorted or faint.	The tape heads are dirty.	Clean the tape heads.
TUNER UNIT	Cannot listen to any station, or signal appears weak.	The station is not tuned-in properly. A TV set is being used nearby and is interfering with the radio reception.	Properly tune-in the desired station. Turn-off the interfering TV set.
	The sound is distorted.	The antenna is not oriented properly.	Re-orient the antenna until reception improves.
CD PLAYER	CD stops immediately after starting, or unit pauses or stops during play.	The CD is inserted upside down. The CD is dusty or dirty or there is condensation on the CD.	Insert the CD with the printed side right-side up. Carefully clean and dry the CD.
	No sound.	The CD player is paused.	Press the PLAY/PAUSE button.
	Specific CD is noisy, or playback stops or skips.	The CD is scratched, damaged or warped. The disc is very dirty.	The CD should be changed. Carefully clean the CD.
