DEAR JENSEN CUSTOMER

Selecting fine audio equipment such as the unit you've just purchased is only the start of your musical enjoyment. Now it's time to consider how you can maximize the fun and excitement your equipment offers. This manufacturer and the Electronic Industries Association's Consumer Electronics Group want you to get the most out of your equipment by playing it at a safe level. One that lets the sound come through loud and clear without annoying blaring or distortion and, most importantly, without affecting your sensitive hearing.

Sound can be deceiving. Over time your hearing "comfort level" adapts to higher volumes of sound. So what sounds "normal" can actually be loud and harmful to your hearing. Guard against this by setting your equipment at a safe level BEFORE your hearing adapts.

To establish a safe level:

- Start your volume control at a low setting.
- Slowly increase the sound until you can hear it comfortably and clearly, and without distortion.

Once you have established a comfortable sound level:

· Set the dial and leave it there.

Taking a minute to do this now will help to prevent hearing damage or loss in the future. After all, we want you listening for a lifetime.

Used wisely, your new sound equipment will provide a lifetime of fun and enjoyment. Since hearing damage from loud noise is often undetectable until it is too late, this manufacturer and the Electronic Industries Association's Consumer Electronics Group recommend you avoid prolonged exposure to excessive noise.

- Stop operation immediately if any liquid or solid object should fall into the cabinet. Unplug the unit and have it checked by qualified personnel.
- Do not touch the lens or poke at it. If you do, you may damage the lens and the player may not operate properly.
- Do not put anything in the safety slot. If you do, the laser diode will be ON when the lid is still opened.
- 5. If the unit is not to be used for a long period of time, make sure that all power sources are disconnected from the unit. Remove all batteries from the battery compartment, and unplug the AC adaptor from the wall outlet. Make it a practice to remove the AC adaptor by grasping the main body and not by pulling the cord.
- This unit employs a laser. The use of controls or adjustment or performance of procedures other than those specified herein may result in exposure to hazardous radiation.

IMPORTANT NOTE

- This product does not contain a separate Power On / Off switch. After inserting a disc and installing batteries / AC adaptor, simply press the Play button to switch on and play a disc.
- In order to maximize battery life and provide optimum playing time this product incorporates an Auto Power Off function. The power to the player will automatically switch off approximately 30 seconds after a disc has finished playing or when the CD lid is opened.

POWER SOURCE

This CD player operates on two 1.5V DC 'AA' size (UM-3) alkaline batteries (not included) or with an AC adaptor with an output of 4.5V DC/500mA (not included).

To install batteries into the player

- 1. Open the battery compartment cover located on the bottom of the cabinet.
- 2. Insert the two 1.5V DC 'AA' size (UM-3) alkaline batteries into the Battery Compartment following the polarity markings as indicated in the compartment.
- 3. Close the battery door and completely slide it back to its original position.



BATTERY CARE

- Be sure that the batteries are installed correctly. Wrong polarity may damage the unit.
- (a) Do not mix old and new batteries.
 - (b) Do not mix alkaline, standard (carbon-zinc) or rechargeable (nickel-cadmium) batteries.
- If the unit is not to be used for an extended period of time, remove the batteries. Old or leaking batteries can cause damage to the unit and may void the warranty.
- Never attempt to recharge "Non-rechargeable" batteries.
- Do not dispose of batteries in fire, batteries may explode or leak.

Using an adaptor (not included) to power the player

1. Before connecting the adaptor to the player make sure that the AC voltage of the adaptor corresponds to your local AC outlet voltage. The polarity of the adaptor must match to the polarity markings next to the DC jack on the player.





- 2. Plug the 4.5V DC/500mA, AC to DC adaptor into a household AC outlet.
- 3. Insert the DC plug into the jack on the player.

When the adaptor is connected, the batteries will be automatically NOTE: disconnected and the player will now operate on the adaptors power. Once the adaptor is unplugged the player will automatically switch to back to battery power.

EARPHONES & AC ADAPTOR CONNECTION

Connect your AC adaptor and Headphone Jack as shown



BASIC OPERATION

NOTE: For correct operation of CD control functions, please press and hold the respective buttons and release them slowly.

- Slide the CD Lid Open button to the left to release the CD lid.
- 2. Insert a disc with the label side facing up.
- Close the CD Lid. A click will be heard when it locks into place.



- 4. Press the PLAY/PAUSE ►■■ button once to start playing. The CD player will turn on and " -- " flashes in the display. A few seconds later, the total number of tracks and total playing time of the CD will be shown in the display. The player will start to from track 1 with the elapsed time shown in the display at the same time.
- Adjust the volume by pressing the Volume +/- Button. There is a slight delay when you first adjust the volume and the display changes from CD track number to Volume level.
- To enhance the bass sound, Press the BBS Button to turn on the BASS BOOST function.

NOTE: The bass boost performance will be increase or decrease depending on the volume level.

7. Locating a particular track

To skip back to the beginning of the current or a previous track	Press ⊷ once or repeatedly.
o skip to the beginning of following tracks	Press ▶ once or repeatedly

8. Locating a Particular Point in a Track

To search back at a high speed	Press and hold I
To search forward at a high speed	Press and hold ▶

9. The playback will stop when the last track on the CD has finished playing.

Turning Power On and Off

To turn ON and OFF, press the following buttons after a disc is inserted into the player.

To turn ON: Press PLAY/PAUSE ▶■ button (playback starts)
To turn OFF: Press STOP ■ button once for standby mode.

Press STOP button again to turn off the power.

Auto power-off function

When the unit is stopped (Standby mode) or if no buttons are pressed for approximately 30 seconds, the power will automatically turned off.

To Remove the Disc

- Press the CD LID OPEN button to open the CD compartment lid.
- Hold the edge of the CD and gently press the center spindle as illustrated and remove the disc.



CAUTION: WAIT FOR THE DISC TO STOP SPINNING BEFORE SLIDING THE OPEN SWITCH AND OPENING THE LID.

- Manufacturer is not responsible for the playability of CD-R/RW due to recording conditions such as PC performance, writing software, media ability, etc.
- Do not attach a label or seal to either side of the CD-R/RW. It may cause a malfunction.

LCD DISPLAY INFORMATION

When the button is pressed at initial start up

- The display will show "- -" and then the total number of tracks and total playing time. The disc will start playing and the display will show the first track number and instant playing time.
- To review the total number of tracks and total playing time of the disc, press the STOP button once.

During PLAY mode

The track number and instant playing time are displayed.

During PAUSE mode

When the track playback is paused, the playing time flashes.

Battery Low Indicator

A flashing battery indicator ** appears in the display when the batteries need to be changed.

VARIOUS PLAYBACK MODES

NORMAL PLAYBACK

The whole disc is played and the player will stop after the last track is finished. Every time the **MODE** button is pressed, the corresponding mode appears in the display window, in the following sequence:

REPEAT 1 During play or stop mode press the MODE button once

When shown on the LCD display, the current track on the disc will be repeated.

REPEAT ALL During play or stop mode press the MODE button twice

ALL When shown in the LCD display, all tracks on the disc will be repeated.

To cancel the Repeat function, press the **MODE** Button repeatedly until "C) 1" or "C) ALL " disappears in the Display.

INTRODUCTARY SCAN

To play the first 10 seconds of each track on the disc.

- 1. In STOP mode press the MODE button three times, INTRO is displayed.
- Press I button to start INTRO play from track number 01.
- 3. If INTRO mode is selected during play, INTRO will start flashing in the display.
- Press >II button. INTRO stops flashing and INTRO play starts from track 01.
- Press ►►I to start INTRO play from next track.
- Press + to start INTRO play from current track.
- To cancel INTRO play, press ▶ again. Playback continues on current track.

RANDOM

To enable all the tracks on the disc to be played in a Random sequence.

- In STOP mode press the MODE button four times, RANDOM Indicator, "SHUFF", will be displayed.
- 2. Press button. A track is selected at random and playback begins.
- If RANDOM mode is selected during play, "SHUFF" will appear and flash in the LCD Display.
- 5. Press the MODE Button again to return to normal play mode.

PROGRAMMED PLAY

Programs can be set either in STOP or normal play mode.

 Press the PROG button once, PROG No. 01 appears. PROG and Track No. 00 start flashing in the display.



- Press ► or ► to select the desired track.
- When the desired track is displayed, press the PROG button to register. The PROG No. changes to 02. Track No. returns to 00 and flashes together with PROG.
- Repeat steps 2 and 3 to program more tracks.
 Up to 20 tracks can be programmed into the memory.
- Press I to start the programmed play.
- 6. To erase the program, in STOP mode simply press the >1 button.

DIGITAL ANTI-SHOCK OPERATION

This player incorporates the latest digital anti-skip circuitry that prevents interruption during playback if the unit is subjected to shock or vibration. The anti-skip system will automatically be activated when a disc is played and will show the flashing icon "ANTI-SHOCK" in the display.

The sound will mute for approximately 1 second while the buffer fills when the PLAY button is first pressed. Once full ២, the buffer will give approximately 60 seconds of protection against interruptions due to shock or vibration. If the player is subjected to continuous shock or vibration for longer than the buffer memory allows, some interruption of sound output will occur. This is normal and to be expected and the sound will resume once the player has stabilized from the shock or disturbance and the buffer refills.

NOTE:

The Anti-skip function provides for continuous sound output when the unit is subjected to shock or vibration. It will not compensate for errors arising from the use of defective, scratched or dirty discs.

PLAYER MAINTENANCE

Cleaning the Cabinet

Wipe with a soft cloth. If the cabinet is very dirty, dampen the cloth with a weak solution of neutral detergent and water, and then wipe clean.

Cleaning the Lens

A dirty lens will cause sound skipping and, if the lens is very dirty, the CD may not work. Never touch the lens with your finger or press down on the lens assembly. Damage may occur or you may scratch the lens. Open the disc cover and clean the lens as follows:

Dust or Dry Particles

Using a camera lens brush/blower, blow on the lens a couple of times, wipe it lightly with the brush to remove dust. Then, blow on the lens once more.

DISC CLEANING AND TROUBLESHOOTING GUIDE

Cleaning the Disc

When a disc becomes dirty, clean it with a cleaning cloth. Wipe the disc from the centre out.



Note

Do not use solvents such as benzene petrol, thinner, commercially available cleaners or anti-static spray intended for analogue discs.
